The contractor or subcontractor agrees that a good faith effort shall include compliance with the following procedures:

- (A). If the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for a construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor shall, within three business days of the contract award, seek assurances from the union that it will cooperate with the contractor or subcontractor as it fulfills its affirmative action obligations under this contract and in accordance with the rules promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31, et. seq. as supplemented and amended from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act. If the contractor or subcontractor is unable to obtain said assurances from the construction trade union at least five business days prior to the commencement of construction work, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to attempt to hire or schedule minority and women workers directly, consistent with the applicable employment goal. A. GENERAL INFORMATION & CONDITIONS

1.0 **PURPOSE & INTENT**

- 1.1 The purpose of this contract is to supply the residents and visitors to the Borough of Beachwood, New Jersey with a safe and entertaining Fireworks Show/Display to celebrate the independence of our country on the Fourth of July 2024.
- 1.2 It is the intent of these specifications to describe the minimum requirements and standards for the Borough of Beachwood's Fireworks Show/Display. All items, features or services not specifically mentioned which are necessary or which are regularly furnished in order to provide a satisfactory performance, shall be furnished by the successful bidder at the bid price and shall conform in quality of materials and workmanship to that usually provided by the practice indicated in this specification.
- 1.3 Bids are desired only from those vendors who have thoroughly read the specifications and the applicable bid proposal form and who understand fully what is required, and who intend to comply in all respects. All bids shall be made with such an understanding.
- 1.4 All references to the "Borough" in this specification shall mean the "Borough of Beachwood and other sponsoring agencies" of the show/display.

2.0 QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS

- 2.1 Personnel: Bidders shall furnish a minimum of **FOUR** (4) **EXPERIENCED PERSONNEL** to deliver, meet, unload, secure, setup, protect, shoot and cleanup the fireworks display at the specified firing site.
- 2.2 Pyrotechnician (lead person/operator and assistants (helpers/shooters): Bidders shall furnish <u>ONE (1) LEAD PERSON and</u> <u>THREE (3) ASSISTANTS</u>. Each shall be factory trained and qualified to perform said work as prescribed in the specifications.

2.3 Required Experience

- 2.3.1 Pyrotechnician (lead person/operator): The factory trained lead person shall have a minimum experience of **TWELVE (12)** electrically fired Pyrotheatrical shows/displays
- 2.3.2 Assistants (helpers/shooters): Each factory-trained assistant shall have a minimum experience of <u>FIVE (5)</u> electrically fired Pyrotheatrical shows/displays, within the past five (5) years.
- 2.3.3 Evidence of experience: **BIDDERS SHALL PROVIDE CERTIFICATION WITH THEIR BIDS** that the Pyrotechnician (lead person) and Assistants (helpers) meet the requirements of this provision. Pyrotechnician and crew must provide documental evidence of display experience in a shore/beach environment.

2.0 QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS (CONTINUED)

2.3 Required Experience (Continued)

- 2.3.4 Hazmat Endorsement: Each driver shall possess a valid driver's license with a **HAZMAT ENDORSEMENT** attached.
- 2.3.5 This Certification shall be provided in the following manner:
- 2.3.5.1 Bidders shall provide not only a listing of the names of the actual Pyrotechnician and assistants but the list SHALL DESIGNATE whether the person or persons listed is a Pyrotechnician or an Assistant.
- 2.3.5.2 The list shall name the Borough and State where the shows took place and it shall state the formal Training each has received pertaining to pyrotechnics.
- 2.3.5.3 The list of Pyrotechnician and assistants shall be accompanied by a letter signed by an officer of the Contractor's firm which shall certify that the Pyrotechnician and assistants are employees of said firm and have the required experience to perform the fireworks show/display contract specified by the Borough .
- 2.3.5.4 Each bidder shall furnish with their bid, the names of at least four (4) municipalities and/or businesses in the tri-state area for whom shows/displays of similar quality and scope have been performed in the past five (5) years. The Borough reserves the right to utilize these references or performances on any contract in making its award determination.

<u>Note:</u> THE CONFIDENTIALITY OF THIS LIST SHALL BE PROTECTED TO THE FULLEST EXTENT AS PERMITTED BY LAW.

3.0 REQUIRED EMPLOYEES/SAFETY EQUIPMENT

- 3.1 All employees of the Contractor shall be over the legal age of eighteen (18) years old and shall be in good health and of high moral character and fluently able to speak, read and understand the English language.
- 3.2 **THE CONTRACTOR SHALL EMPLOY ALL STAFF UTILIZED IN THE STAGING OF THE SHOW/DISPLAY**. Sub-contracted employees **SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED** for the firing portion of the show/display.

3.3 **Required Employee Safety Equipment**

- 3.3.1 The contractor shall be responsible to <u>provide</u> each employee with the following safety equipment items:
 - 3.3.1.1 Flame retardant long sleeve shirt
 - 3.3.1.2 Flame retardant long pants
 - 3.3.1.3 Hard hat
 - 3.3.1.4 Eye protection (goggles/safety glasses)
 - 3.3.1.5 Ear protection/plugs

3 COUNTER OFFERS

3.2 Bids containing statements, rates and/or conditions that contradict those contained in this specification and applicable bid shall be considered a counteroffer and shall result in the rejection of the bid proposal.

4 SHOW/DISPLAY REQUIREMENTS

- 4.2 **Scope:** The bid proposal shall include the furnishing of all labor to deliver, receive, unload, secure, setup, fire and cleanup all shows/displays; all transportation and except as herein provided, all necessary materials required to fire the show/display.
- 4.3 Dates & Time of Display: Fireworks shall be fired on Tuesday July 4, 2024 starting promptly at <u>9:00 PM</u>, EDT and concluding at <u>9:23 PM</u>, EDT (minimum of a 23 minute show/display).
- **4.4 Length of Show: The show shall not be less than <u>twenty-three (23) minutes</u> in duration. The program shall be fired in a time frame that will ensure that a complete balance of the music and fireworks are maintained throughout the duration of the show/display.**
- 4.5 **Delays:** The Borough and its representatives reserve the sole right to delay and/or postpone the display due to inclement weather and/or high winds. Delay or postponement shall strictly follow NFPA 1123 (current addition) guidelines.
- 4.5.1 <u>Rain Date</u>: the following rain dates have been scheduled in the event of a postponement: Wednesday, July 5, 2024, @ 9:00 PM, EDT.
- 4.5.2 The Borough shall not pay any additional compensation to the contractor in the event of a rain and/or weather delayed show. Upon completion of the contracted show on the re-scheduled date, the Borough shall not pay the amount indicated in the original contract.
- 4.6 Firing Site (Land Based Show): The Borough of Beachwood shall provide an adequate and safe firing site, that meets or exceeds NFPA 1123 (current edition), located at the beachfront on the designated area on the bluffs above the Borough river front bathing beach. It shall be the contractor's sole responsibility to transport the shells to the actual firing site on the bluffs. It shall be the Borough 's responsibility to secure the site prior, during and after the fireworks show/display.
- 4.7 Firing Equipment (Land Based Show): Firing racks shall be "California Design" and contain only high-density plastic tubes. Racks shall be securely fastened together for firing, safety and stability. Once the firing tube has been loaded, a one-inch piece of masking tape shall be placed horizontally across the opening to show that the tube is ready for firing. This will also permit a visual determination once the show is complete, if the tube was properly discharged at the conclusion of the show.

5 SHIPMENT & SAFETY OF THE PYROTECHNICS

5.2 Land Based Show/Display

- 5.2.1 The Contractor shall transport the fireworks to the specified firing location only on the day of the display. Shipment shall be made in a closed vehicle properly identified in accordance with Federal, State and Local laws and regulations.
- 5.2.2 Each vehicle utilized in the transport of the fireworks shall be properly labeled with: The Placard: Explosives 1.3.G
- 5.2.3 All fireworks shall be transported in accordance with the Federal and State D.O.T. Laws regarding the transportation and handling of hazardous materials.

6 **DUDS & MISFIRE CREDITS**

6.2 Payment deductions shall be made for all shells, which fail in operation. Such determination shall be based on the percentage of failure by written verification of the respective Borough officials and the Contractor's representative. The Contractor's representative shall take charge of all duds and dispose of same as required by law.

6.3 Low break aerial shells shall be viewed as a 100% failure and a full credit for the unfired shell shall be given to the Borough .

7 STORAGE & SECURITY AT THE DISPLAY LOCATION/SITE

- 7.2 The Contractor shall provide proper storage and security for the fireworks at the specified location.
- 7.3 Under no circumstances are the fireworks to be left unattended by the Contractor's employees after delivery.
- 7.4 Only those persons identified by the Contractor prior to the show shall be allowed into the designated restricted areas to fire the display.
- 7.5 FOR SAFETY REASONS, NO OTHER INDIVIDUALS SHALL BE PERMITTED TO ENTER OR REMAIN IN THE DESIGNATED RESTRICTED FIRING AREA.
- 7.6 ALL FIREWORKS PIECES SHALL BE FIRED UNLESS THEY ARE FOUND TO BE DAMAGED OR UNSAFE FOR USE. In that case, they shall be properly secured by the contractor and the Borough shall receive a credit for the shells that were not fired.

8 CONTRACTOR'S SUPERVISOR(S)

- 8.2 The Contractor shall designate a supervisor as a contract person who can be reached on Tuesday, July 4, 2024 or Wednesday, July 5, 2024, as may be required. Bidders shall provide the name and telephone number of said proposed supervisor(s) with the bid proposal package.
- 8.3 The Contractor's supervisor shall be required to be on site and available to both the New Jersey State Fire Inspector and designated Borough personnel throughout the day of the designated show. Additionally, the Contractor's supervisor shall be capable of addressing and dealing with any issues that may be brought to their attention throughout the day by either party.

9 FIELD INSPECTION & VERIFICATION OF INVENTORY

9.2 The Borough 's representatives shall verify shell quantity and type prior to the start of the show and will take an inventory of all unfired shells after the show has been completed.

10 REQUIRED FIRE PROTECTION AT THE STAGING & FIRING SITE

- 10.2The Contractor shall provide all necessary fire extinguishers and safety equipment for the designated staging/firing area.
- 10.3The Borough shall provide at least (1) one fire pumper and various Fire and Police Department personnel to be located throughout and adjacent to the restricted staging/firing area.

11 WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS TO THE OPERATOR

11.2The Contractor shall be responsible for issuing written instructions on the requirements of this contract to all its operators prior to the commencement of the show.

12 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR AFTER THE DISPLAY HAS BEEN FIRED

Land Based Show/Display

12.2.1 Immediately after the display, the Contractor shall be required to gather and remove all firing devices and fill holes made in the beach to prevent accidents and or possible liability. The Contractor shall remove all parts of shells not fired and clean up

all debris to avoid danger of injury of accidents from partially exploded pieces lying on the ground and/or the beach. All debris shall be removed from the site by the Contractor in accordance with Federal, State and Local Laws.

- 12.2.2 A representative of the Contractor shall remain at the firing site until all of the holes have been filled and the grounds cleared to the satisfaction of the Borough and State representatives.
