VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED FOR:

violation (of this section) for any unauthorized person or organization to collect, pick up or cause to be collected or picked up within the boundaries of the municipality any of the recyclable materials designed in subsection 14-3.3 of this section. Each such collection in violation of this section shall constitute a separate and distinct offense punishable as hereinafter provided (sub-section 14-3.11 (a) Violations and Penalties..... By a fine not less than two hundred fifty \$250.00 dollars, nor more than \$1,000.00 dollars. (b) Each and every day in which a violation of any of the provisions of this section exists shall constitute a separate offense. 2.
